

## Packing and Transport: Discussion Summary

Green = process

Red = output

Yellow = influences

A decision has been made to move an object.

Risk assessment phase

- happen in parallel
- not sequentially which will inform a decision from a conservation perspective

If decision is we can't move it

- need to review the risk assessment

If decision is too move it

- we go into scheduling and implementation process which may or may not involve treatment

Outside influences and context may change and all bets still might be off

Various outputs:

- updating data
- reconfirming data
- ordering equipment material contractors
- may involve links with other databases (finance, budget control),
- scheduling—you might treat, crate

Finally you get to move it

- it might be in the institution
- external to the institution

Time frame could be minutes to years, what is critical there is an ongoing updating of location

Quite often there is a sub-set of moves in risk assessment

Just like the treatment, it's probably useful to have some kind of materials and instructions (as a resource to feed in and be made available during process)
